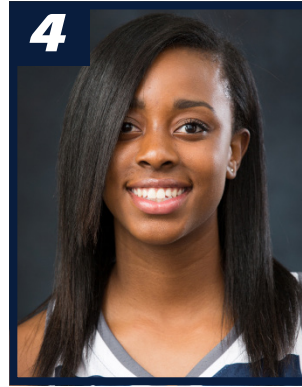

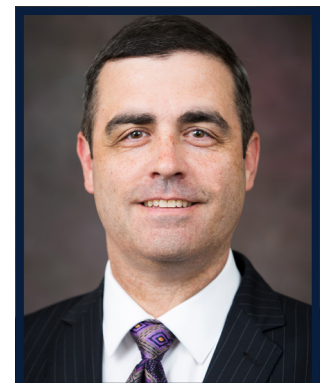

2016-17 SEASON OUTLOOK

New expectations are set for the Lancers in 2016-17 with a blend of experience and youth.

Longwood returns 10 letterwinners from an injury-riddled 8-22 team a season ago and welcomes five newcomers that will add size and depth for the 2016-17 campaign.

Head coach **Bill Reinson** enters his seventh season as the bench boss of the blue and white, amassing a 47-128 overall record in his previous six seasons. His 2016-17 squad promises to be one of the deepest and most talented in his tenure.

With the starting frontcourt returning intact, Reinson will look to guide his team on a tournament run similar to the 2012-13 team that reached the Big South Championship game, where the Lancers fell to Liberty, 54-45.

A season after playing a trio of NCAA Tournament teams — including NCAA runner-up Oregon State — Longwood will once again face a gauntlet of non-conference games. Highlighted in that stretch is a contest at college basketball mecca Cameron Indoor Stadium where the Lancers will square off against national powerhouse Duke. The game against the Blue Devils will see

eighth-year Longwood assistant coach **Wanisha Smith** return to her alma mater.

In addition, the Lancers will square off against NCAA Tournament participant West Virginia for the second straight season, as well as contests against Conference USA foes Marshall and Charlotte.

Part of the returning core of upperclassmen is senior **Eboni Gilliam** and junior point guard **Micaela Ellis**, who both played in all 30 games last season while combining for 50 starts.

A junior college transfer, Gilliam enjoyed a strong first season with the Lancers, as the Richmond, Va., product finished the season ninth in the Big South in rebounding with 6.7 boards per contest to go along with 7.6 points. After scoring in double figures in five of her final nine games, Gilliam will look to build off that momentum entering her final collegiate season.

Gilliam will look to lead a frontcourt that promises to be a strength for the Lancers, as Longwood returns sophomore **Kemari Jones** and 2015-16 team captain **Brenna Robbins**. Longwood will also welcome back 6-5 post player **Emily Nysten** to bolster the frontcourt rotation.

Longwood's second-leading rebounder a season ago, Jones returns to the court after being sidelined with a broken arm in the squad's last four games on 2015-16.

In addition, the Lancers welcome junior college transfer **Jovana Vukovic** and ESPN three-star recruit **Winnie Miller**. Longwood's third international signing under Reinson, Vukovic has the potential to make an immediate impact and become an elite inside presence in the Big South.

Junior Micaela Ellis returns for her second season as team captain and looks to lead the Lancers from the point once again.



Junior **Autumn Childress** looks to take that next step for the Lancers, as she has the potential to step into a starter's role and will be counted on on the offensive end of the floor.

Meanwhile, Ellis will be counted on in a leadership role after serving as a team captain as a sophomore last season. The 5-5, pass-first Ellis ranked among the top-five in the conference with 2.9 assists per game. She secured three or more assists in 19 games while registering five-plus dimes on five occasions.

Ellis leads a backcourt tandem along with sophomore **Ciarah Bennett** that has the potential to form one of the most dynamic combinations in the Big South.

As a freshman, Bennett showed the ability to get to the basket and play through contact, as she scored in double figures in three games with a season-high 20 points against Radford.

Longwood will look to fill the void left by the sharp-shooting pair of Kyn-dal Skersick and Deborah Headen. **Ashlee Jones** will have the chance to make an impact, as she showed the ability to stretch defenses with substantial range beyond the three-point line. In addition, the Lancers will look to the freshmen combination of **Jada Russell**, **Dayna Rouse** and **Khaila Hall** to provide a shooting presence around the perimeter.

Rouse — a three-star ESPN recruit — has displayed the ability to defend the length of the floor while Russell joins the Lancers after playing for high school powerhouse Neumann-Goretti, who she helped win a national and state championship.

In addition, Hall joins the backcourt after being named the Rowan County Female Athlete of the Year by the Salisbury Post.

Also returning after sitting out last season is **Treasure Avery**, who possesses the unique ability to create her own shot.

Reinson returns each of his three assistant coaches from last season. Former Duke All-American standout Smith is the most experienced of the assistant's, as she is now entering the eighth season of her career at Longwood.

Sherrie Tucker, a former MEAC Player of the Year at Coppin St., returns for her fourth year on Reinson's staff, while **Rachel Travis**, a former NAIA standout at Northwest University, enters her third season on Longwood's bench.

Bill Reinson begins his 14th season in the athletics department at Longwood and seventh season as the leader of the women's basketball program. Throughout his tenure, Reinson has guided the Lancers to a 47-128 mark since taking over as interim head coach on Dec. 6, 2010. He was officially elevated to the head coaching position following the 2010-11 season on April 12, 2011.

Throughout his seven-year tenure, Reinson has guided the Lancer program into the Big South era. His 2012-13 team advanced to the VisitMyrtleBeach.com Big South Championship game before falling to Liberty. He was named the 2013 Virginia Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by the Richmond Times-Dispatch. In addition, Reinson has coached the program's only three 1,000-point scorers in the Division I era, including Daeisha Brown, Chelsea Coward and Crystal Smith.

During his tenure, Longwood has tested itself against many of the top programs in the nation, playing the likes of Notre Dame, Maryland and Oregon State. The Lancers have played four games against ranked competition, with three games against teams inside the top-10.

The 2015-16 season saw Reinson guide the Lancers to an 8-22 overall record and a 5-15 mark in the Big South, as injuries plagued the roster throughout the season with just three players on the 16-man roster having played in each of the team's 30 games. Reinson oversaw the development of Longwood's roster, in particular, Micaela Ellis who led the team in assists and minutes. Longwood was led in scoring by senior Kynadal Skersick and redshirt-junior Brown, who each averaged 9.0 points per game. In addition, junior college transfer Eboni Gilliam provided a rebounding and low-post threat for the Lancers, leading the team and ranking among the top-10 in the Big South with 6.9 boards per contest.

In addition, Brown became the 21st player in program history and the third player in the Division I era to tally 1,000 career points in a Longwood uniform Feb. 20, 2016 at Radford. Brown became the fastest player in the Division I era to reach 1,000 points, doing so in her 80th career game, five games faster than it took Coward to reach the milestone.

The 2014-15 campaign saw Reinson lead Longwood to a 4-26 overall record. Injuries plagued the Longwood roster throughout the campaign, with ACL tears to Brown, a Preseason Second-Team All-Big South selection and leading rebounder Khlaliah Ali. Reinson oversaw the development of Raven Williams who elevated her level of play despite the injury to Brown, aver-

aging 13.3 points per contest to earn Honorable Mention All-Big South honors.

Perhaps, Reinson's biggest regular season victory came during the 2013-14 season where the Lancers downed Xavier, 67-64. It was the highlight of the season for a Longwood squad that posted an 8-22 overall record, including a mark of 5-15 in Big South competition. The Lancers were led by backcourt duo of Brown and Williams, who each averaged in double figures.

In 2012-13, Reinson guided his squad to a 14-19 overall record, including an 8-10 mark in the program's inaugural season in the Big South, and an appearance in the VisitMyrtleBeach.com Big South Championship game. The Lancers' 14 wins marked the most victories for the team since its first year playing a Division I schedule back in 2007-08 (16). Under Reinson's guidance, the Lancers won their first four games of the Big South era, including its Big South debut at Gardner-Webb.

The team earned the No. 7 seed for the tournament before winning three-straight postseason games to advance to the conference's title game against in-state foe Liberty University. Longwood's run to the Championship marked just the third time in Big South history that a No. 7 seed played in the championship game. For his efforts, Reinson was recognized as the 2013 Virginia Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by the Richmond Times-Dispatch.

Reinson's first full season in leading the blue and white saw the Lancers finish with a 7-22 mark. The Lancers played two games against top-15 opponents, including a narrow 56-45 defeat at No. 11 Georgetown in the season-opener. Longwood also faced national-power Maryland. The Lancers had three double figure scorers throughout the season, including Smith (11.2 PPG), Brittani Billups (11.0 PPG) and Coward (10.3 PPG).

After taking over the program six games into the 2011-12 season and being elevated to interim head coach from men's assistant coach, Reinson guided the Lancers to six of their seven victories throughout the season. Following a 1-5 start to the season, Reinson took the reins of the program and earned his first victory of his tenure with a 74-70 decision against Wright State.

Prior to taking over the women's program, Reinson had been an assistant coach with the Longwood men's program since 2002. He served as the interim men's head coach for two games (1-1) late in the 2002-03 season, his first at the school, due to an illness of the head coach at that time.

Additionally, he was an assistant women's coach with the Lancers for the final 13 games of 2002-03 (27-5)

under Longwood's all-time winningest coach and 2015 Longwood Hall of Fame inductee Shirley Duncan during the final year of Division II eligibility, helping the team to an 11-2 record in those games while winning the CVAC Tournament and advancing to the second-round of the NCAA East Regional.

His first position in the coaching ranks saw Reinson serve two seasons (2000-02) as an assistant men's coach at UNC Greensboro. During his time at UNCG, Reinson learned under the tutelage of current Iowa head coach Fran McCaffery. The Spartans went 39-23 overall throughout his two seasons, winning the 2001 Southern Conference Tournament Championship. UNC Greensboro earned one NCAA Tournament appearance (2001) and made one NIT appearance (2002).

A native of Mesa, Arizona, Reinson earned his Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from the University of Phoenix. He and his wife, Lana, have seven daughters: Megan (28), a graduate of Virginia Tech, Bria (23), Taylor (19), twins Ashley (14) and Brittany (14), Krystal (13), and Mia (9) along with three sons: Dominic (16), Niko (15) and Spiros (13).

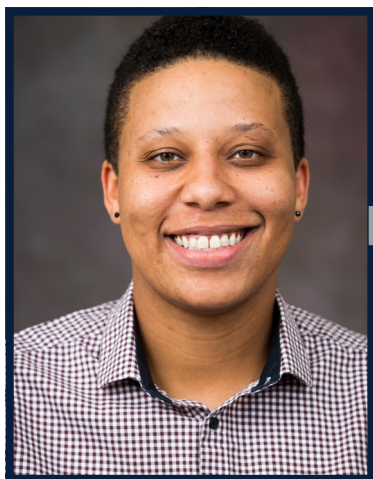

WANISHA SMITH

Duke, '08

A former WBCA All-American at Duke, Wanisha Smith begins her eighth season at Longwood in 2016-17, beginning her employment June 25, 2009.

Head coach Bill Reinson's most experienced assistant, Smith works with the team's guards while also working in recruiting, scouting opponents on the Lancers schedule and helping with individual practice sessions. In addition, she oversees the coaching in camps and clinics.

Throughout her seven seasons, Smith has assisted in guiding the Lancers into the Big South era and helped the squad advance to the Big South Championship game in its first season in the league, before falling to Liberty.

The 2015-16 season saw Longwood post an 8-22 overall record and a 5-15 Big South ledger, as injuries plagued the roster throughout the season with just three players on the 16-man roster having played in each of the team's 30 games. Smith played a heavy role in the development of sophomore Micaela Ellis who led the team in assists and minutes played from the point guard position.

In addition, her work with Daeisha Brown helped her become the 21st player in program history and the third player in Longwood's Division I era to tally 1,000 career points in a Longwood uniform. Brown became the fastest player in the Division I era to reach 1,000 points and joined former teammates Chelsea Coward and Crystal Smith in accomplishing the feat.

The 2014-15 campaign saw Smith assist in leading Longwood to a 4-26 overall record. Injuries plagued the Longwood roster throughout the campaign, with ACL tears to Brown, a Preseason Second-Team All-Big South selection and leading rebounder Khlaliah Ali. Smith oversaw the development of Raven Williams who elevated her level of play despite the injury to Brown, as Williams averaged 13.3 points per contest in 2014-15 to earn Honorable Mention All-Big South honors.

In 2012-13, Smith assisted the squad to a 14-19 overall record, including an 8-10 mark in the program's inaugural

season in the Big South, and an appearance in the VisitMyrtleBeach.com Big South Championship game. The Lancers' 14 wins marked the most victories for the team since its first year playing a Division I schedule back in 2007-08 (16). Under Smith's guidance, the Lancers won their first four games of the Big South era, including its Big South debut at Gardner-Webb.

The team earned the No. 7 seed for the tournament before winning three-straight postseason games to advance to the conference's title game against in-state foe Liberty University. Longwood's run to the championship marked just the third time in Big South history that a No. 7 seed played in the championship game.

She was a four-year standout at Duke University and the 27th overall selection in the 2008 WNBA Draft by the New York Liberty. Smith briefly played in the WNBA during 2008 with the Detroit Shock.

Smith played her first three years at Duke under head coach Gail Goestenkors, one of the winningest coaches in women's college basketball. She helped lead the Blue Devils to an average of 32 wins during her career, and was selected a team captain for 2007-08. Smith completed her career at Duke ranked fourth in assists (496), including a freshman record (154) during 2004-05. She was the 22nd Blue Devil to reach 1,000 career points, finishing her outstanding career with 1,256 points.

A native of Upper Marlboro, Maryland, Smith earned a Bachelor of Science degree in women's studies at Duke in 2008. She was previously The Washington Post Metro Player of the Year, the Gatorade Maryland Player of the Year, a Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) All-American, and a McDonalds All-American in 2003-04, while also the Ohio Player of the Year as a high school sophomore.

Sherrie Tucker is in her fourth year with the Longwood women's basketball team after joining the staff as an assistant coach in June 2013.

Tucker, who brings a winner's mentality to the program, is involved in all facets of the program. She has been the team travel coordinator, academic and film exchange liaison and is presently responsible for post-player skill development, camps and special projects. Tucker also plays a vital role in recruiting, scouting and overseeing the day-to-day basketball operations.

Coach Tucker arrived at Longwood University after serving as an assistant coach for Team Sol, an AAU basketball program out of Largo, Md. She was also head coach for the Villa Maria boy's basketball team in Harford County, Md.

A Philadelphia native, Tucker was a standout at Coppin State University where she led the Lady Eagles to a pair of Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) regular-season titles, MEAC Tournament championships and NCAA Tourna-

ment appearances (2004-05, 2005-06). She was a two-time MEAC Player of the Year and All-MEAC first team honoree. Tucker, who earned her squad's Most Valuable Player award for three consecutive years, finished her career ranked third all-time at Coppin State with 1,389 points. As a junior, Tucker averaged career highs of 15.3 points and 4.7 rebounds in 33.8 minutes per game. During her senior campaign, she shot a personal-best .412 (175-425) from the field.

Upon graduation, Tucker looked to pursue a career in professional basketball. From 2007-2008, she played professionally for the Etzella Basketball Club in Luxembourg.

Tucker's No. 40 jersey hangs in the Physical Education Complex at Coppin State University where, in February 2016, she became one of only two women's basketball players in Coppin State history to have her jersey retired. She is also a member of the Coppin State University Athletics Hall of Fame.

Tucker finished her career at Coppin State in 2006, graduating with her bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice.

Rachel Travis joined the Longwood women's basketball staff as an assistant coach in August, 2014, completing her second year with the Lancers after the 2015-16 season.

Travis has overseen several roles in her time with the blue and white. She has been the squad's travel coordinator, as well as the squad's academic and film liaison. Travis also plays a vital role in recruiting, scouting and overseeing the day-to-day basketball operations.

In her two years of assisting with the Lancers, Travis has helped the squad win 12 games, as the squad has had a pair of injury-riddled seasons under her watch. In 2014-15, Longwood posted a 4-26 record with Daeisha Brown, a Preseason All-Big South selection, and leading rebounder Khalilah Ali limited to just a handful of games due to ACL tears.

In 2015-16, Travis and the Lancers went 8-22 overall, as the squad saw the emergence of sophomore Micaela Ellis, who led the team in assists and minutes. In addition, she aided in the development of Kemari Jones and Eboni Gilliam.

Travis came to Longwood after spending the previous four years as a head coach at the high school level, running the varsity girls' programs at Florida Air Academy in Melbourne, Fla., and Episcopal School of Jacksonville in Jacksonville, Fla.

In her first year at Florida Air, she helped guide the team to the 2012-13 3A District Championship. The squad went 10-0 in district play and 20-5 overall while advancing to the regional finals. The team also advanced to the regional final that year.

Prior to her two-year stint at Florida Air, Travis held the varsity girls basketball head coaching position at the Episcopal

School of Jacksonville for the 2010-11 and 2011-12 academic years.

A 2009 graduate of Northwest University in Kirkland, Wash., Travis has affected the lives of young people in a variety of roles. In addition to her responsibilities as head basketball coach, Travis also taught psychology and physical education at both Florida Air and the Episcopal School.

Travis began her coaching career as a girls basketball camp director and coach at Episcopal in the summer of 2010, the same year she began her semi-professional playing career.
