### *2017-18 SEASON OUTLOOK*


New expectations are set for the Lancers in 2017-18 with a blend of experience and youth.

Longwood returns eight letterwinners from an injury-riddled 4-26 team a season ago and welcomes 10 newcomers that will add size and depth for the 2017-18 campaign.

Head coach **Bill Reinson** enters his eighth season as the bench boss of the blue and white, amassing a 51-154 overall record in his previous seven seasons. His 2017-18 squad promises to be one of the deepest and most talented in his tenure, as the Lancers look to make a similar run in the Big South Tournament as the 2012-13 squad that advanced to the Big South Championship game.

Longwood's 2017-18 roster features 10 newcomers, including three transfers. The newcomers for the Lancers add a blend of size, experience and will look to make an immediate impact on the court.

Leading the charge for the Lancers is senior point guard **Micaela Ellis**, who is coming off a dynamic junior season in which she finished with 133 assists to rank fifth all-time in the Longwood record books in single season assists. The Oak Park, Mich., native enters the season 45 assists



shy of entering the top 10 all-time in the program's history in career assists and sits just 100 assists away from breaking Longwood's Division I record.


Ellis will be counted on for more than her play on the court for the 2017-18 version of the Lancers, as she earned the trust of her teammates and coaching staff by being named team captain. It marks the third straight season that the senior has been named captain and the second straight season that she has been the lone captain on the squad.

In addition to Ellis, the Lancers return sharp-shooting **Kate Spradlin** to the lineup a season after she led the Lancers in three-point percentage.

After spending the first two seasons of her career as a walk-on, Spradlin was rewarded a scholarship over the summer. In addition, the doit-all athlete has joined the women's cross country team for the fall, finishing with the team's top time in the race at Navy.

Following a breakout freshman season, **Khaila Hall** looks to follow-up that performance during her sophomore campaign. Hall was among the top freshman in the Big South a season ago, averaging 6.7 points along with 3.4 rebounds per game. In addition, the Cleveland, N.C., native had 2.1 assists per contest to rank second on the squad behind Ellis.

With Ellis, Hall and Spradlin leading the way, the Lancers will bring in a number of seasoned veterans off the bench, including spark plug **Ciarah Bennett**, along with sharp shooters **Ashlee Jones** and **Jada Russell**. In addition, Longwood's first recruit in the Division I era from the state of Georgia in **Stephanie Guihon** will

factor heavily into the rotation off the bench, while freshman **Que King** will also be a role-player for the Lancers.

In the frontcourt, the Lancers will look upon senior **Autumn Childress** and sophomore **Dayna Rouse** to play starring roles.

Limited to 13 games a season ago due to injuries, Childress averaged 8.2 points per game and scored in double figures in five of the 13 games she played.

Meanwhile, Rouse had a breakout season in which she played 15 games with three starts in a season that was cut short due to injury. Rouse led the Lancers in scoring in four games, including a season-best 23 points in Longwood's loss to Marshall.

The Lancers will look to replace the production of Eboni Gilliam after she led Longwood with 10.4 points per game. Gilliam became the first Lancer to sign an overseas contract in the Division I era, signing to begin her professional career in Spain.

Transfer **Rosemary Ilang** will look to fill the gap from Gilliam after enjoying success at Blinn College and Western Texas Community College. Two-sport athlete **Mallory Odell** will also look to make a strong first impression with the Lancers after a high school career that saw her score more than 1,000 points in high school.

In addition to a wide range of 10 newcomers, the Lancers welcome a pair of new coaches to the sideline for 2017-18. Former Big South Champion at Winthrop, **Antwon Harris** joins the staff after spending last season as the head women's basketball coach at Highland Community College in Freeport, III.

Messiah Reames also joined the Lancer staff during the summer, after spending time coaching at the high school level, the Philly Triple Threat AAU program and working as a skills assistant with James Madison and George Washington. A native of

Philadelphia, Pa., Reames finished his collegiate career at Cabrini University as a three-time PAC All-Conference selection and scored 937 career points.

Reames and Harris weren't the only changes for the Longwood

coaching staff, as fifth-year coach and two-time MEAC Player of the Year **Sherrie Tucker** was elevated to associate head coach in August.

# BILL REINSON

Head Coach

Eighth Season (16th at Longwood) University of Phoenix, '00 Career Record: 51-154 (Seven Seasons) Longwood Record: Same

Bill Reinson begins his 16th season in the athletics department at Longwood and eighth season as the leader of the women's basketball program. Throughout his tenure, Reinson has guided the Lancers to a 51-154 mark since taking over as interim head coach on Dec. 6, 2010. He was officially elevated to the head coaching position following the 2010-11 season on April 12,

Throughout his seven-year tenure, Reinson has guided the Lancer program into the Big South era. His 2012-13 team advanced to the VisitMyrtleBeach.com Big South Championship game before falling to Liberty. He was named the 2013 Virginia Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by the Richmond Times-Dispatch. In addition, Reinson has coached the program's only three 1,000-point scorers in the Division I era, including Daeisha Brown, Chelsea Coward and Crystal Smith.

During his tenure, Longwood has tested itself against many of the top programs in the nation, playing the likes of Duke, Notre Dame, Maryland and Oregon State. The Lancers have played four games against ranked competition, with three games against teams inside the top-10.

The 2016-17 campaign saw Reinson guide Longwood to a 4-26 overall record and a 1-17 mark in the Big South. Reinson saw the devlopment of Eboni Gilliam, who averaged a team-leading 10.4 points per game. In addition, Reinson helped in the development of Micaela Ellis, who finished the season with 133 assists for most assists in the school's D-I era. Ellis also finished with a school-record 15 assists in Longwood's win against Winthrop.

The 2015-16 season saw Reinson guide the Lancers to an 8-22 overall record and a 5-15 mark in the Big South, as injuries plagued the roster throughout the season with just three players on the 16-man roster having played in each of the team's 30 games. Reinson oversaw the development of Longwood's roster, in particular, Micaela Ellis who led the team in assists and minutes. Longwood was led in scoring by senior Kyndal Skersick and redshirt-junior Brown, who each averaged 9.0 points per game. In addition, junior college transfer Eboni Gilliam provided a rebounding and lowpost threat for the Lancers, leading the team and ranking among the top-10 in the Big South with 6.9 boards per contest.

In addition, Brown became the 21st player in program history and the third player in the Division I era to tally 1,000 career points in a Longwood uniform Feb. 20, 2016 at Radford. Brown became the fastest player in the Division I era to reach 1,000 points, doing so in her 80th career game, five games faster than it took Coward to reach the milestone.

The 2014-15 campaign saw Reinson lead Longwood to a 4-26 overall record. Injuries plagued the Longwood roster throughout the campaign, with ACL tears to Brown, a Preseason Second-Team All-Big South selection and leading rebounder Khlaliah Ali. Reinson oversaw the development of Raven Williams who elevated her level of play despite the injury to Brown, averaging 13.3 points per contest to earn Honorable Mention All-Big South honors.

Perhaps, Reinson's biggest regular season victory came during the 2013-14 season where the Lancers downed Xavier, 67-64. It was the highlight of the season for a Longwood squad that posted an 8-22 overall record, including a mark of 5-15 in Big South competition. The Lancers were led by backcourt duo of Brown and Williams, who each averaged in double figures.

In 2012-13, Reinson guided his squad to a 14-19 over-

all record, including an 8-10 mark in the program's inaugural season in the Big South, and an appearance in the VisitMyrtleBeach.com Big South Championship game. The Lancers' 14 wins marked the most victories for the team since its first year playing a Division I schedule back in 2007-08 (16). Under Reinson's guidance, the Lancers won their first four games of the Big South era, including its Big South debut at Gardner-Webb.

The team earned the No. 7 seed for the tournament before winning three-straight postseason games to advance to the conference's title game against in-state foe Liberty University. Longwood's run to the Championship marked just the third time in Big South history that a No. 7 seed played in the championship game. For his efforts, Reinson was recognized as the 2013 Virginia Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by the Richmond Times-Dispatch.

Reinson's first full season in leading the blue and white saw the Lancers finish with a 7-22 mark. The Lancers played two games against top-15 opponents. including a narrow 56-45 defeat at No. 11 Georgetown in the season-opener. Longwood also faced national-power Maryland. The Lancers had three double figure scorers throughout the season, including Smith (11.2 PPG), Brittani Billups (11.0 PPG) and Coward (10.3 PPG).

After taking over the program six games into the 2011-12 season and being elevated to interim head coach from men's assistant coach, Reinson guided the Lancers to six of their seven victories throughout the season. Following a 1-5 start to the season, Reinson took the reins of the program and earned his first victory of his tenure with a 74-70 decision against Wright State.

Prior to taking over the women's program, Reinson had been an assistant coach with the Longwood men's program since 2002. He served as the interim men's head coach for two games (1-1) late in the 2002-03 season, his first at the school, due to an illness of the head coach at that time.

Additionally, he was an assistant women's coach with the Lancers for the final 13 games of 2002-03 (27-5) under Longwood's all-time winningest coach and 2015 Longwood Hall of Fame inductee Shirley Duncan during the final year of Division II eligibility, helping the team to an 11-2 record in those games while winning the CVAC Tournament and advancing to the second-round of the NCAA East Regional.

His first position in the coaching ranks saw Reinson serve two seasons (2000-02) as an assistant men's coach at UNC Greensboro. During his time at UNCG, Reinson learned under the tutelage of current lowa head coach Fran McCaffery. The Spartans went 39-23 overall throughout his two seasons, winning the 2001 Southern Conference Tournament Championship. UNC Greensboro earned one NCAA Tournament appearance (2001) and made one NIT appearance (2002).

A native of Mesa, Arizona, Reinson earned his Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from the University of Phoenix. He and his wife, Lana, have seven daughters: Megan (28), a graduate of Virginia Tech, Bria (23), Taylor (19), twins Ashley (14) and Brittany (14), Krystal (13), and Mia (9) along with three sons: Dominic (16), Niko (15) and Spiros (13).

# SHERRIE TUCKER

Associate Head Coach

Fifth Season Coppin State, '06

Sherrie Tucker is in her fifth year with the Longwood women's basketball team after being elevated to her current role of associate head coach in the summer of 2017. Tucker originally joined the Longwood joining the staff as an assistant coach in June 2013.

Tucker has been involved in all aspects of the program since her arrival to campus. She has been the team travel coordinator and academic and film exchange liaison. She's presently responsible for post-player skill development, camps and special projects, along with playing a vital role in recruiting, scouting and overseeing the day-to-day basket-ball operations.

In her role with Longwood's post players, Tucker aided in the development of former Lancer Eboni Gilliam, who became the first Longwood graduate to sign a professional contract when she signed in Spain earlier this summer. Gilliam averaged 9.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 24.0 minutes throughout her two seasons for the blue and white after transferring in from Cape Fear Community College following her sophomore season.

Tucker oversaw Gilliam's numbers improve across the board her in her second season at Longwood as her scoring (10.7), minutes (27.5), field goal percentage (.438), free throw percentage (.667), assists (14) and blocks (14) all saw a spike. She also recorded seven double-doubles and finished in double figures 21 times over her Longwood career.

Coach Tucker arrived at Longwood University after serving as an assistant coach for Team Sol, an AAU basketball program out of Largo, Md. She was also head coach for the Villa Maria boy's basketball team in Harford County, Md.

A Philadelphia native, Tucker was a standout at Coppin State University where she led the Lady Eagles to a pair of Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) regular-season titles, MEAC Tournament championships and NCAA Tournament appearances (2004-05, 2005-06). She was a two-time MEAC Player of the Year and All-MEAC first team honoree. Tucker, who earned her squad's Most Valuable Player award for three consecutive years, finished her career ranked third all-time at Coppin State with 1,389 points. As a junior, Tucker averaged career highs of 15.3 points and 4.7 rebounds in 33.8 minutes per game. During her senior campaign, she shot a personal-best .412 (175-425) from the field.

Upon graduation, Tucker looked to pursue a career in pro-

fessional basketball. From 2007-2008, she played professionally for the Etzella Basketball Club in Luxembourg.

Tucker's No. 40 jersey hangs in the Physical Education Complex at Coppin State University where, in February 2016, she became one of only two women's basketball players in Coppin State history to have her jersey retired. She is also a member of the Coppin State University Athletics Hall of Fame.

Tucker finished her career at Coppin State in 2006, graduating with her bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice.

As head coach at Highland, Harris oversaw several aspects of the program, leading the program to 14 wins in his first season in a head coach capacity. In addition to his coaching duties, Harris was responsible for coordinating team outings, conducting fundraisers and gaining sponsorships.
